Just ran across this survey as I was researching the Wood Tract. Kevin had mentioned this to me: that the tribe had an aquatic lease on "our" tidelands. This is just a survey, and doesn't mean that the lease was granted, but thought I' bring it up.

By my understanding, we have complete control of all of the tidelands fronting on the spit, although we consider it less than fee title. I'm not sure I understand how DNR could issue a lease.

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
